



Texas Market Transformation

- Four programs approved by the Public Utility Commission of Texas:
 - Energy Star New Homes Program
 - Energy Star Windows Program
 - Air Conditioning Distributor Program
 - Air Conditioner Installer Training Program
- The focus is on measures with the greatest peak demand reduction potential.



Energy Star Homes MTP

- Pilot Programs Completed in 2001
 - Reliant Energy HL&P (CenterPoint - new)
 - Oncor (TXU Electric - old)
- 2001 Program Activity: 1,450 Homes
- 2002 New Homes Goal: 7,450 Homes



Energy Star Windows MTP

- Pilot program completed in 2001
 - AEP (CPL, WTU, SWEPCO - old)
- 2001 Program Activity: 8 MW
- 2001 Budget: \$450,000
- 2002 Program Activity: On Hold while PUCT determines how new statewide building energy codes will affect the window market.



A/C Distributor MTP

- Pilot programs completed in 2001
 - Oncor and Reliant
- 2001 Program Activity: 5 MW
- 2001 Budget: \$450,000
- 2002 Program Activity:
 - Oncor, Reliant and Xcel Energy (SPS - old)
 - 18 A/C Distributors

A/C Installation Training MTP

- 2002 Program Activity:
 - Oncor is the first to initiate program
 - Bids for baseline studies submitted 4/22



General Issues for 2002

- How will the new statewide building energy codes affect the baseline used to measure program savings?
- How accurately can we quantify the peak demand reduction and energy conservation impacts of programs that rely on training, education, and advertising?
- How will program activities in one year affect market changes and savings in future years?
