

MT Program Evaluation



- 1. Programs based on market theory
- 2. Whole program impacts are difficult to quantify
- 3. What's needed:
 - 1. Data
 - 2. Planning
 - 3. Patience
 - 4. Policy aligned with program goals
 - 5. Perspective of whole market (multi-jurisdiction)
