Georgia continues to report below-average levels of electricity savings. The state has performance incentives for utilities, which help to encourage some investment in energy efficiency. It also considers the proximity of transit facilities when distributing federal Low-Income Housing Tax Credits to qualifying property owners. While the state has more electric vehicles (EV) registered per capita than most states, its burdensome EV registration fee is among the highest in the United States and impedes consumer EV adoption. Focusing on efficiency policies across the buildings, state government, and industrial sectors could significantly improve Georgia's standing in the State Scorecard.


